What is this Product?

Type This Product is a UCITS with the legal form of an open-ended investment company (Société d'Investissement à Capital Variable, or SICAV). This Product is a portfolio of eligible financial instruments that you will hold collectively with other investors and that will be managed in accordance with its objectives.

Term This Product does not have a specific expiry date. It may, however, be dissolved or merged, in which case you will be informed by any appropriate means as specified in the Product rules.

Objectives

- The objective of the UCITS is to outperform the capitalised €STR (overnight rate of the euro interbank market) over its minimum recommended investment period of one day, incorporating SRI in its management approach. This seeks to select securities adhering to the responsible criteria pertaining to the environment, social and governance (ESG) framework. The €STR (Euro Short-Term Rate) is the money market benchmark calculated by the ECB (European Central Bank). In the event of very low market interest rates, the return generated by the UCITS will not suffice to cover the UCITS' management fees and the UCITS would see its net asset value fall structurally.
- The Sub-Fund is actively managed. The Benchmark is used for comparison purposes only. The Delegated Investment Manager remains free to choose the stocks that make up the portfolio in accordance with the Sub-Fund's investment policy.
- The Benchmark can be used to determine the performance fee that will possibly be levied.
- The UCITS' investment policy is based on a rigorous selection of money market instruments and equivalent securities by the Delegated Investment Manager. The main criteria for this selection are, on the one hand, quantitative criteria such as the term and financial conditions and, on the other hand, qualitative criteria such as the rating of these securities.
- The Product falls under the classification: money market funds with a short-term variable net asset value.
- The UCITS' initial investment universe includes private or public entities in the OECD area issuing negotiable debt securities and/or short-term bonds, denominated in euro or any other OECD-area currency. It is composed solely of issuers of high credit quality in accordance with an assessment and methodology defined by Ostrum AM.

Selection of issuers in portfolios based on ESG elements is then put in place for each category of issuers. For private issuers, the rating is based on 4 pillars: responsible governance (e.g. business ethics); sustainable management of resources (e.g. quality of working conditions); energy transition (e.g. reduction in greenhouse gases); territorial development (e.g. access to basic services). Ultimately, the delegated investment manager remains the sole judge of the extra-financial quality of the issuer.

For quasi-sovereign issuers and green sovereign issuers, the extra-financial assessment is based on the SDG Index, which is derived from the UN's 17 SDGs (Sustainable Development Goals). As an example, the following criteria may be monitored: social (public spending on education), governance (share of women parliamentarians), human rights (ratio between years of education received by women and by men). The SDG Index is a numerical score between 0 (the lowest rating) and 100 (the highest rating),

The SRI analysis of the UCITS covers at least 90% of the net assets, calculated on transferable securities eligible for SRI analysis: debt securities issued by private and equivalent issuers as well as green sovereign issuers and quasi-sovereign issuers.

After analysing the investment universe described above, the transferable securities are selected by the delegated investment manager based on their financial and extra-financial characteristics.

The SRI management process selects issuers by adopting a so-called "average rating" approach, aiming to outperform the initial investment universe filtered to exclude 25% (up to 31 December 2025, then 30% from 1 January 2026) of the lowest-rated issuers (in terms of ESG), for private issuers, quasi-sovereign issuers and green sovereign issuers.

The portfolio of the UCITS is exclusively composed of short-term money market instruments that adhere to the criteria of Directive 2009/65/EC, and equivalent securities of any type. These are primarily issued by the private sector, the public sector or by governments.

The SICAV is invested in money market instruments denominated in euros (fixed rate, floating rate, adjustable rate or indexed securities). The SICAV may invest in securities denominated in the currency of an OECD member country other than the euro. Currency risk is systematically hedged.

Green bonds, social bonds, sustainability bonds and sustainability-linked bonds that may be held by the UCITS will, as a minimum, comply with the Green Bond Principles, the Social Bond Principles, the Sustainability Bond Guidelines and the Sustainability-Linked Bond Principles. All of these principles and guidelines are published as part of the Principles of the ICMA (International Capital Market Association)

The UCITS can make term deposits of up to 100% of its net assets. By way of derogation, it may invest more than the regulatory limit of 5% of its net assets, and up to 100% of its net assets, in money market instruments issued or guaranteed individually or jointly by certain sovereign, quasi-sovereign or supranational entities.

- The Product accumulates its income.
- Redemption requests are received every day by 1:00 p.m. at the latest and are executed daily.

Intended retail investors The Product seeks to achieve a performance equal to the money market index less management fees and is intended for investors who wish to diversify their investments in money market instruments and term deposits; can afford to tie up their capital for a recommended period of one day (very short-term horizon); and can sustain temporary losses.

The summary risk indicator is a guide to the level of risk of this product compared to other products. It shows how likely it is that the product will lose money because of movements in the markets or because we are not able to pay you.

We have classified this Product as 1 out of 7, which is the lowest risk class. In other words, the potential losses arising from the Product's future results are very low, and if the market situation were to deteriorate, it is very unlikely that our ability to pay you would be affected.

Other material Product risks not factored into the SRI calculation: credit risk, counterparty risk, risks related to the impact of the management techniques used.

This risk is not considered in the indicator shown above. If the currency of the Product is the same as the currency in which you purchased it, you will not be affected by this currency risk.

What happens if Natixis Investment Managers International is unable to pay out?

The assets of your Product are held at its Depositary, CACEIS Bank, and are distinct from those of the Management Company. As such, should Natixis Investment Managers International become insolvent, your Product's assets will not be affected. However, should the Depositary or a subdepositary entrusted with the custody of your Product's assets become insolvent, there is a risk of financial loss. However, this risk is mitigated to some extent because the Depositary is required by law and by the Product rules to separate its own assets from those of the Product. As provided for by law, there is an investor guarantee or compensation scheme should the Depositary default.

What are the costs?

The person advising on or selling you this Product may charge you other costs. If so, this person will provide you with information about these costs and how they affect your investment.

Costs over time

The tables show the amounts that are taken from your investment to cover different types of costs. These amounts depend on how much you invest, how long you hold the Product and how well the Product does. The amounts shown here are illustrations based on an example investment amount and different possible investment periods. We have assumed:

- In the first year, you would get back the amount that you invested (0% annual return); For the other holding periods, the Product performs as shown in the moderate scenario;
