### WHAT IS THIS PRODUCT?

#### TYPF

ODDO BHF ProActif Europe is a UCITS under Directive 2009/65/EC, taking the form of a Fonds Commun de Placement.

#### **TFRM**

ODDO BHF ProActif Europe was created on 10 September 2004 for a term of 99 years.

#### **OBJECTIVES**

The investment objective of the Fund is to outperform the benchmark index (50% compounded €STR + 8.5 basis points and 50% EURO STOXX 50 NET RETURN calculated with dividends reinvested (Bloomberg code: SX5T INDEX)) over the minimum investment horizon of three years through a flexible allocation between the equity market and money market instruments over a minimum investment horizon of three years.

The Fund is a stock-picking fund and is managed on a discretionary and active basis with reference to its benchmark. The investment process is based on (i) actively managing the asset allocation, divided between equity and money markets, through a tactical and strategic allocation determined according to an economic scenario, market valuations and portfolio risk management, and (ii) selecting shares or equity securities through an investment process that favours a contrarian, stock-picking approach.

The Fund's composition may deviate significantly from that of the benchmark index.

Between 0% and 100% of the Fund's assets may be invested in equities traded on regulated markets and issued by companies headquartered within the European Economic Area (EEA) or in a European member of the OECD.

Equities issued by companies headquartered outside the Euro Zone may be held in the equity component up to a maximum of 40% of net assets.

The Fund may invest in equities from any economic sector and with any market capitalisation. Only 10% of the Fund may be exposed to emerging markets.

Between 0% and 100% of the Fund's assets may be invested in transferable debt securities or money market instruments (maximum maturity of two years) or securities received under repurchase agreements (maximum period of three months). The transferable debt securities and money market instruments will be securities issued by governments, public entities or private corporations, denominated in euro and will be rated at least BBB+ (long-term rating by Standard and Poor's, Moody's or equivalent, or using the Management Company's internal rating).

Securities acquired in reverse repurchase translations will be issued by governments, public institutions or private companies and denominated in euro, and will have a rating of A- to AAA (from Standard and Poor's, Moody's or equivalent, or using the Management Company's internal rating), with a maximum of 5% of assets held in securities rated below A- but no lower than BBB- (Standard and Poor's, Moody's or equivalent, or using the Management Company's internal rating). The Management Company does not use the ratings issued by rating agencies automatically or in isolation, as it also applies its own internal analysis. In the event of a downgrade, the Management Company will take the interests of unitholders, market conditions and its own analysis of these money market instruments into account when respecting rating limits.

The Fund may invest up to 10% of its net assets (i) in units or shares of UCITS under European Directive 2009/65/EC, (ii) in EU AIFs and/or in foreign investment funds mentioned in R.214-25 that meet the criteria of article R.214-13 of the French Monetary and Financial Code. These funds may be managed by the companies belonging to the BHF group and will be compatible with the Fund's investment strategy.

Without seeking overexposure, the Fund may invest in financial futures or options traded on French or foreign regulated markets or over the counter for the purposes of hedging equity risk or exposing the Fund thereto and/or hedging currency risk. This shall be limited to 40% of the net assets.

The Fund's maximum exposure to the instruments (equities, debt securities, funds and derivatives) may not exceed 100% of net assets, it being understood that the maximum exposure is the sum of the net exposures to each of the markets (equity, fixed income, money) to which the Fund is exposed (the sum of long and hedging positions).

Subscription and redemption requests are centralised by the custodian every Paris stock exchange trading day until 11:15 (Paris time, CET/CEST) and executed on the basis of the net asset value of the same day.

CR-EUR units accumulate their income.

### INTENDED RETAIL INVESTOR

The Fund is intended for investors seeking to increase the value of their capital through a vehicle investing flexibly in equities and fixed income products and aiming to outperform the benchmark index over a period of at least three years. US Persons may not invest in this product.

# RISK INDICATOR





The risk indicator assumes you keep the product until the end of the recommended holding period, i.e. three years. The actual risk can vary significantly if you cash in at an early stage and you may get back less.

### WHAT HAPPENS IF ODDO BHF ASSET MANAGEMENT SAS IS UNABLE TO PAY OUT?

The product is a co-ownership of financial instruments and deposits separate from the portfolio's Management Company. In the event of the company's insolvency, the product's assets, which are held by the custodian, would be unaffected. In the event of the custodian's insolvency, the risk of financial loss on the product would be mitigated by the legal segregation of the custodian's assets from the product's assets.

## WHAT ARE THE COSTS?

### COSTS OVER TIME

The tables show the amounts taken from your investment to cover the different types of cost. These amounts depend on how much you invest, how long you hold the product, and the return on the product. The amounts given here are illustrations based on a sample investment and different possible investment periods.

We have assumed:

- In the first year you would get back the amount that you invested (0% annual return). For the other holding periods we have assumed the product performs as shown in the moderate scenario

<sup>\*</sup>This illustrates how costs reduce your return each year over the holding period. For example it shows that if you exit at the recommended holding period your average return per year is projected to be 2.94% before costs and -1.22% after costs.

We may share part of the costs with the person selling you the product to cover the services they provide to you. They will inform you of the amount.

### COMPOSITION OF COSTS

### Minimum recommended holding period: over 3 years

This recommended holding period is a minimum that takes into account the features of the selected product. It may be longer, depending on your financial position and investment choices.
