What is this product?

Type I Undertaking for Collective Investment in Transferable Securities - Société d'Investissement à Capital Variable (SICAV), incorporated in France.

Term I The life of the product is 99 years. This term may be extended or the Fund can be dissolved early on the initiative of its Board of Directors. The terms and conditions for extension or dissolution are described in more detail in the articles of association of the SICAV.

Objectives | Echiquier Positive Impact Europe seeks performance over the long-term, net of management fees, through exposure to European equity markets and via companies whose business activities provide solutions to the challenges of sustainable development and which stand out for the quality of their governance and social and environmental policies. The objective of the subfund is combined with an extra-financial approach incorporating environmental, social, and governance (ESG) criteria and an impact score.

The MSCI EUROPE NR index is a representative benchmark for the management of Echiquier Positive Impact Europe. This benchmark is used solely for information purposes. It reflects the trends on the equity markets of Europe's most developed countries. It is calculated in euros, with dividends reinvested. Investors are advised that the portfolio's composition may differ from that of the benchmark index.

The UCITS implements an active and discretionary management based on a rigorous stock picking process, involving direct meetings with the companies in which the subfund invests. The fund is permanently exposed between 60% and 100% to European equities (European Union, European Free Trade Association and United Kingdom). The maximum exposure to small and mid-caps will be 60%. However, for the subfund to be eligible for the French regulated equities savings scheme (PEA), 75% of its assets are invested in European equities.

Securities are selected in two stages:

1.First step: Analysis of the investment universe

The investment universe consists of the securities making up the indices: Stoxx Europe Total Market (80%) + MSCI USA Large Cap (20%).

It is analysed using socially responsible investment (SRI) criteria, in order to identify the companies with the best practices in terms of sustainable development. This analysis is based on a proprietary tool of the LBP AM group for the extra-financial rating of issuers: GrEAT, and on the other hand on the application of exclusions.

The analysis of the investment universe presented above allows for the elimination from the universe of 25% of the worst-rated issuers and/or the issuers on the exclusion lists applicable to the portfolio. This enables the pivot GREaT score to be defined. This pivot GREaT score is the score of the last issuer excluded from the universe after the above-mentioned adjustments. The portfolio can then invest in any issuer having a GREaT score higher than the pivot GREaT score of the portfolio.

2. Second step: Selection of securities according to their financial and extra-financial characteristics:

Following this first step, the manager carries out a fundamental analysis of each issuer based on the following criteria:

- -Analysis of the company's management
- Quality of its financial structure

- Visibility on future earnings
- Analysis of the financial results
- The growth prospects for its business
- The speculative nature of the share

The impact is measured prior to investment. The analysis of their contribution to the challenges of sustainable development is conducted for each issuer. It is conducted prior to the investment. This results in a score (Impact score) that provides us with more comprehensive knowledge of the companies with the aim of minimising the risks and capitalising on the opportunities related to the investment in sustainable development challenges. The contribution is analysed through the turnover generated by the products and services that provide solutions to the challenges of sustainable development and the analysis of significant initiatives implemented by the company to make a positive contribution to these challenges. The management team has decided to use the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) framework to assess these criteria.

The UCITS reserves the right to invest a maximum of 10% in fixed-income products. At the time of acquisition and for monitoring purposes over the life of the securities, credit risk is assessed on the basis of in-house research and analysis by La Financière de l'Echiquier and using the ratings produced by agencies. The eligible securities in question are deemed to be investment grade, i.e., having a minimum Standard & Poor's rating of BBB- or equivalent or considered as such by the management team.

Subscription/redemption procedures I Subscription and redemption orders are centralised daily at noon and executed at the net asset value calculated on the basis of the day's closing market prices. What are the risks and what could I get in return?



The synthetic risk indicator makes it possible to assess the level of risk of this product compared to other products. It indicates the likelihood that the product will incur losses in the event of market movements or if we are unable to pay you.

We have classified this product in risk class 4 out of 7, which is a medium risk class. In other words, the potential losses related to the product's future results are at a medium level and, if the situation deteriorates on the markets, it is possible that the ability to pay you will be affected.

The synthetic risk indicator is based on the assumption that you hold the shares for the whole recommended investment period of five years.

The other materially relevant risks not taken into account in the calculation of the product's SRI are as follows:

- Credit risk
- The markets on which the fund invests may occasionally be affected by a temporary lack of liquidity; its net asset value may therefore fall more rapidly and significantly due to pricing conditions, as a result of which it could be led to liquidate, initiate or modify positions.

What happens if La Financière de l'Échiquier is unable to pay out?

The product is incorporated as a separate entity to the Management Company. In the event of failure of the Management Company, the assets of the product held by the custodian will not be affected.

What are the costs?
