What is this product?

This product is a unit of a mutual fund qualifying as an undertaking for collective investment in transferable securities (UCITS).

This sub-fund has no maturity date. However, the board of directors may decide to close the sub-fund under certain circumstances.

Objectives

The objective of the IFP Luxembourg Fund - Global Environment Fund sub-fund is to deliver long-term capital growth through bond and equity investments in corporate securities exposed to environmental and quality-of-life themes. The sub-fund is actively managed. The sustainable investment process is based on fundamental analysis, combining financial and non-financial criteria. The sub-fund invests in securities of companies benefiting from the themes of sustainable resources, quality of life, sustainable infrastructure, alternative energies and energy efficiency. The sub-fund invests in global securities as follows:

- up to 60% in bonds or convertible bonds;
- up to 40% in other assets, mainly shares. Equity investments may include, on an ancillary basis, shares of listed companies carrying out private equity or micro-finance type investments;
- up to 49% in cash and cash equivalents as well as in short-term money market instruments;
- the sub-fund may use derivatives for hedging purposes or for effective portfolio management.

The objective of the sub-fund is to offer sustainable investment within the meaning of Article 9 of the Sustainability Regulation and to contribute to a reduction in carbon emissions in order to achieve the long-term targets to limit global-warming set by the Paris agreement.

Benchmark: The portfolio is actively managed on a discretionary basis without reference to a benchmark.

Intended retail investor

The sub-fund is particularly suitable for an investor with a balanced profile who appreciates the mixed asset allocation of the sub-fund.

Other information

Depositary: Banque et Caisse d'Epargne de l'Etat, Luxembourg

Dividend income: This class is a capitalisation class meaning that income is reinvested.

Conversion right: The investor has the right to convert his investment in units in one sub-fund for units in the same sub-fund or in another sub-fund. The investor can obtain information about how to convert in the prospectus of the fund.

Segregation: The assets and liabilities of a sub-fund are segregated pursuant to the law so that the commitments and liabilities of one subfund do not affect the other sub-funds.

What are the risks and what could I get in return?

Risk indicator



The summary risk indicator is a guide to the level of risk of this product compared to other products. It shows how likely it is that the product will lose money because of movements in the markets or because we are not able to pay you.

We have classified this product as 3 out of 7, which is a medium-

low risk class.

This rates the potential losses from future performance at a mediumlow level, and poor market conditions are unlikely to impact our capacity to pay you.

Be aware of currency risk. You may receive payments in a currency that differs from your reference currency, so the final return you will get depends on the exchange rate between the two currencies. This risk is not considered in the indicator shown above.

The sub-fund is also exposed to the following materially relevant risks that are not included in the summary risk indicator: Liquidity risk, Counterparty risk, Operational risk

What happens if IFP Investment Management S.A. is unable to pay out?

If we are not able to pay you out what we owe you, you are not covered by any national compensation or guarantee scheme. To protect you, the assets are held with a separate company, the depositary Banque et Caisse d'Epargne de l'Etat, Luxembourg. Should we default, the investments are liquidated and the proceeds are distributed to the investors. In the worst case, however, you could lose your entire investment.

What are the costs?

The person advising on or selling you this product may charge you other costs. If so, this person will provide you with information about these costs and how they affect your investment.

Costs over time

The tables show the amounts that are taken from your investment to cover different types of costs. These amounts depend on how much you invest, how long you hold the product and how well the product does. The amounts shown here are illustrations based on an example investment amount and different possible investment periods.

We have assumed

- In the first year you would get back the amount that you invested (0% annual return). For the other holding period we have assumed the product performs as shown in the moderate scenario
- 10,000 EUR is invested

(*) This illustrates how costs reduce your return each year over the holding period. For example it shows that if you exit at the recommended holding period your average return per year is projected to be 5.6% before costs and 1.1% after costs.

We may share part of the costs with the person selling you the product to cover the services they provide to you. They will inform you of the amount. These figures include the maximum distribution fee that the person selling you the product may charge (0.1% of amount invested / 10 EUR). This person will inform you of the actual distribution fee.

A maximum conversion fee of 0.5% is charged for the conversion of part or all of the units.

How long should I hold it and can I take money out early?

Recommended holding period: 5 years

You should be prepared to stay invested for 5 years. However, you can redeem your investment without penalty at any time during this time, or hold the investment longer. Redemptions are possible on each full bank business day in Luxembourg. In exceptional circumstances, your right to request the redemption of your investment may be limited or suspended.
